



Thieves Arrested

In the last edition of the Henderson Herald, we warned thieves to 'watch out' because police were working closely with local people to catch anyone involved in burglary – particularly over the Christmas

period. Across Norwich, 121 burglary offences were reported to the police between 1 December 2013 and 31 January

As a result of the police's hard work and local information, there have been over 25 arrests with many of the thieves being charged and some even being convicted already. In some cases, officers from West and North Earlham, Larkman and

Marlpit were key to the success of the targeted operation.
Police from the Henderson Trust area said that evidence from local people was sometimes the only way that they could catch the thieves or secure a good result. They continued to say that they really appreciated residents coming forward with information and that they were always keen to hear what people had to say.
