Everyone has the right to feel and be safe at all times within a relationship. Domestic abuse or violence is never justified!

Domestic abuse includes financial, emotional, psychological or sexual control and threatening behaviour, as well as physical violence and stalking. It is committed by current or former partners or family members, including young people and adults, men and women.

### **Thieves** Watch Out! **The West Norwich Policing Team is working** hard this


Christmas to make sure that you are not a victim of anti-social behaviour and crime. **Operation 'Bombard' will target** offenders of theft crimes across the Henderson Trust area. A range of tactics and resources will be used in the area including collaboration with colleagues from specialist services such as dog units and the use of local plain clothed officers on foot patrol. Local **Policing Commander Inspector Nigel Richards from Earlham** Police Station emphasised the continued hard work of his officers during this festive period stating that most thefts are opportunistic. "We can all help to reduce the likelihood of

being burgled if we remember to lock our house windows and doors and by removing presents from full view when leaving your car". He said.

# If it's a Cold, Keep your



### bugs to Yourself

Henderson Herald GP, Doctor Mary Dun of the Wensum Valley Medical Practice offers her advice on dealing with a cold.

Although getting a common cold is only a mild viral infection of the nose, throat, sinuses and upper airways, getting a cold can be a totally miserable experience and can make you feel awful.

There is still no cure for a cold, although you can usually relieve the symptoms of a cold at home by taking some over-the-counter medication, such as paracetamol, and drinking plenty of fluids..

In adults, colds usually last for up to a week with younger children sometimes suffering for up to two weeks before the body fights off the infection.

Because there is no remedy for a cold and it should get better on its own, it is usually best to keep your 'bugs' to yourself and not to spread your germs by visiting your doctor. Viral infections are best dealt with at home.

You only really need to see your GP if:

- your symptoms persist for more than three weeks
- you are concerned about your baby or an elderly person.
- you have a high temperature (fever) of 39°C (102.2°F) or above
- you cough up blood-stained phlegm (thick mucus)
- you have a long-term illness
- you feel chest pain
- you have breathing difficulties
- you experience severe swelling of your lymph nodes (glands) in your neck and/or armpits
- you feel unwell with a rash

If you are unsure, you can always phone NHS 111 for an assessment.
