Smi **West Earlham Infant School Tackles Dental Crisis Head On**

After seeing more and more children coming into school with aches and pains in their mouths and tooth decay, West Earlham's deputy head teacher Jade Hunter decided it was time to take action.

With Norfolk and Waveny being recently named one of the five worst 'dental deserts' in the country, Ms Hunter decided to take matters into her own hands.

After speaking to parents, most of whom said they found it almost impossible to find a NHS dentist, Ms Hunter contacted Plummers, a Norfolk-based dentist.

Plummers already gives talks in schools about oral hygiene as part assembly hall of the school. of their Happy Smile Club, and the deputy head asked them to go one step further.

As a result of this, Plummers sent two dentists to the school for a day to carry out check-ups, and if any problems were found the children were referred to the surgery where any issues were rectified.

In total the dentists saw all 180 pupils in the

The idea was so popular that other schools have already been in touch to see how they can provide the same service.

Book in for your Winter Vaccinations

As the temperature drops West **Earlham Health Centre are** reminding people to book in for their annual vaccinations. Flu and Covid-19 are more serious in older people and those with underlying health conditions, and getting up to date with your vaccinations can help reduce the risk and help ease the pressure on the NHS over winter.

These vaccinations are free to people 65 and over, those who



have certain health conditions, are pregnant, are in long stay residential care, receive a carer's allowance or live with someone who is more likely to get an infection due to having a weakened immune system.

To book in for your vaccination you can either call your GP Surgery or contact your Pharmacy (for flu vaccinations) or call 119 or visit the NHS app (for Covid-19 vaccinations)



Free Counselling for Young People

Youth Connect is a service providing free counselling to young people aged between 18 and 25. It is aimed at those living with mental health issues who typically might not access counselling.

The initiative is part of The Norwich Centre and accredited by the British Association of Counselling and Psychotherapy.

Young People can access up to 10 one-hour sessions and will always see the same counsellor. What's even better is that the sessions are easy to access, and young people can self-refer. The service is strictly confidential and takes place in a comfortable setting.
